Course Description

This course aims to improve students' communication skills through Korean multi-media such as TV dramas, movies and songs. It emphasizes the training of listening and speaking skills in authentic everyday situations as they are presented in Korean media, particularly in popular TV dramas. Since the multi-media materials not only provide authentic communication situations but also present real life cultural elements, students will be able to gain a better understanding of many aspects of Korean society while practicing their four language skills. Producing a drama in the middle and the end of the term will be a major assessment method to help students develop their creativity and fluency.

Learning Outcomes

Upon successful completion of the course, students should be able to

- (1) identify a variety of colloquial expressions used in real life context and use them appropriately.
- (2) distinguish the different registers of Korean depending on the level of interpersonal relations and apply the appropriate registers in everyday communicative situations
- (3) create a short drama in the style of Korean TV dramas using a variety of registers and colloquial expressions
- (4) build confidence in improvising and spontaneous speech production.
