Language of instruction	Korean	Unit	3

Course Description
<p>This course is designed to help students improve daily conversational skills learned from Korean multimedia such as dramas, news, advertisements, and K-pops. With exposure to Korean multimedia that reflect various language expressions in different situations, students will be able to learn colloquial Korean and different style of speech while understanding Korean culture and society deeply. This class will provide an opportunity to share students' learnings of media expressions, phrases, grammar, and more through activities, assignments, and group projects using their creativity. Students will also be encouraged to take their learnings further, scrutinize differences in expressions of Korean multimedia, and discover similarities and differences between Korean media expressions and their own countries. All the materials and the medium of instruction will be in Korean.</p>

Learning Outcomes
<p>Upon successful completion of the course, students will be able to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Identify native Korean colloquial expressions used in media and apply them in real-life contexts - Speak, listen, read, and write expressions, vocabularies, and sentences from media effectively and recognize the proper usage - Expand knowledge of Korean culture, society, and customs and be able to share them confidently with other classmates/peers - Connect expressions from each media with grammar and culture and internalize them to remember in the long-term

Assessment Scheme		
Task nature	Description	Weight
Participation	Each student is expected to actively participate in class and share their knowledge of lessons.	10 %
Mini-presentation	Each student is required to deliver a short presentation for ten minutes on the given topic. The presentation should include the following details: - Understanding of Korean culture and comparison with the student's own culture - Analysing the speech style and nuance - At least five new expressions and three grammatical expressions	15 %
Project (Video recording)	In this project, students are expected to choose one type of media, such as drama, news, or advertisement, reinterpret and create its own style. It will be conducted in a team of two to four students, and each student should contribute at least 500 letters of the script. The team should perform together to display creativity using the learned in class. To maximize learning, each student should: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Select a topic related to the learned in class (5 points) 2. Write the draft and finalize the script (35 points) 3. Produce the video (10 points) 4. Individual performance (50 points) Steps (1) to (4) need to be uploaded on the Discussion Board of Blackboard by the due date. The team will receive the same score for (1) ~ (3).	25 %
Assignment	After each class, students should upload the creative dialogue and display their understanding of learned grammar and vocabulary on Blackboard.	15 %
Final Exam	A closed-book exam will test knowledge on grammar, vocabulary, and written expression reviewed in class.	35%

- You are required to attend at least 75% of the class. Treat 75% attendance as the minimum, not the maximum.
- Should you miss more than 25% of the class, you will automatically fail the course.
