### **Course Description**

This course is a summer intensive course which provides basic training in spoken and written Korean, oral practice for various everyday situations and essential grammatical structures. It also gives a general introduction of the Korean society and culture.

Pre-requisites: KORE1000 or equivalent competence.

#### **Learning Outcomes**

Upon successful completion of the course, students should be able to

- (1) read and write the Korean alphabets(Hangeul) without much difficulties;
- (2) talk about topics such as everyday greetings, asking/giving information, shopping in Korean;
- (3) compare and interpret the current Korean society and its culture.

Only the final version of the assignment should be submitted via VeriGuide.

The submission of a piece of work, or a part of a piece of work, for more than one purpose (e.g. to satisfy the requirements in two different courses) without declaration to this effect shall be regarded as having committed undeclared multiple submissions. It is common and acceptable to reuse a turn of phrase or a sentence or two from one's own work; but wholesale reuse is problematic. In any case, agreement from the course teacher(s) concerned should be obtained prior to the submission of the piece of work.
