Course Description

This is the second of a 6-term long language course which provides basic training in spoken and written Korean, oral practice for various everyday situations and essential grammatical structures. It also gives a general introduction of the Korean society and culture.

Pre-requisites: KORE1000 or equivalent competence.

Learning Outcomes

Upon successful completion of the course, students should be able to:

- (1) talk about daily activities in present or the past;
- (2) ask and explain the reason for doing or not doing something;
- (3) understand the current Korean society and its culture.

Assignment	Two assignments will be given throughout the semester. Students must submit them online by the given deadlines. (1) Assignment 1: Unit 7, 8 and 9 of '사랑해요 한국어 1' (50%) (2) Assignment 2: Unit 1, 2, and 3 of '사랑해요 한국어 2' (50%)	15%
Quiz	A closed-book quiz will test vocabulary and grammar covered in Unit 7, 8 and 9 of '사랑해요 한국어 1', and Unit 1 of '사랑해요 한국어 2' through various question types (e.g., multiple choice, fill-in-the-blank, short answer, listening comprehension).	20%
Oral exam	A speaking test will be conducted individually with the course instructor. The date and time will be arranged according to the class timetable.	20%
Final exam	All Korean II courses will join the centralized course exam. It is a closed-book exam including the following components: (1) vocabulary and grammar (60%) (2) reading (20%) (3) writing (20%)	35%

Notes:

- Students are required to arrive on time.
- Students are required to attend at least 75% of classes. Treat 75% attendance as the minimum requirement, not the maximum. The success of learning will highly depend on attendance. **Students who miss more than 25% of classes will automatically fail the course.** In case of absence, it is recommended to get informed about what content and homework missed and make it up.
- **Students are expected to submit all homework, assignments, etc. on time. Late submission will result in mark deductions unless a valid reason is provided.**

- If a student is unable to attend any exam, they must inform the course instructor in advance and provide official supporting documentation (e.g. medical certificate). Otherwise, a make-up exam may not be granted.
