Course Code & Title:	KORE3061 Korean through folktales
Language of Instruction: English/ Korean	Units: 3

Course Description

This course is designed for students to improve on their reading skills by exposing them to famous Korean folktales. Student will learn new vocabularies, expressions and useful phrases including mimetic words, onomatopoeias and idioms. Also, this course will enrich students' understanding of the Korean language and its cultural values. Various topics will be introduced each class and each tale will be read in its simplified version in Korean. There is a designated textbook but extra materials will be distributed on Blackboard in advance.

Pre-requisite: KORE3001 or equivalent competence (Students who have not completed the pre-requisite may still be considered for enrollment. Such students should contact the course instructor to discuss their eligibility for the course.)

Learning Outcomes

After taking this course, students will be able to:

- improve their general reading skills and establish strategies
- work on unknown vocabularies and expressions by using clues from the context
- effectively grasp and comprehend the information in various Korean texts
- expand their range of vocabularies and expressions which can be applied in real-life situations
- gain self-confidence and motivation by communicating in Korean
- gain a profound understanding of the Korean culture, society, customs and values from different perspectives
- communicate effectively similar to native speakers using a variety of expressions

Assessment Type (subject to change)		
Task nature	Description	Percentage
Participation	This considers students' attendance, punctuality, level of participation and the completion of homework.	10%
Project	Each student will upload a video presentation on given topics to the designated platform. The sample format and topic will be introduced by the teacher at the beginning of the course. Students are required to explain the meaning of given expressions and their applications in Korean. They are also expected to compare those expressions with their mother tongue.	20%
Homework	Homework will be assigned after each unit. Students are expected to complete the tasks on time and submit them through Blackboard. Homework may include vocabulary and grammar practice, short writing tasks, rewriting folktales from your culture and so on.	10%
Quiz	Quiz will cover Unit 1 to Unit 4 and it will be conducted on a scheduled date incorporating various question formats such as multiple choice, short answer questions, and describing images.	20%
Final Exam	A closed-book exam will be conducted on a scheduled date and it will include multiple choice, short answer questions, and a reading comprehension section, etc.	35%

Notes:

- ☐ Students are required to attend at least 75% of the class. Treat 75% attendance as the minimum, not the maximum. The success of learning will highly depend on attendance.
- ☐ If a student misses more than 25% of the class, he/she will automatically fail the course.
- ☐ If a student is unable to attend, he/she should review the content and homework that are missed and make them up him/herself.
