Important information on Credit-transfer application (1/3)

About your group level in France:

To be able to transfer credits, you should take a course of a higher level than the last course you took in the CUHK French Programme.

You should **NOT repeat the same level, NOT repeat the same content as the last French course you took at CUHK**. For instance:

A.You studied French 2 (FREN2000) at CUHK: you should enroll in a class equivalent to French 3 (FREN2001) & French 4 (FREN3000). You should **NOT** enroll in a course equivalent to French 2 (FREN2000) or French 1 (FREN1000).

B.You studied French 4 (FREN3000) at CUHK, you should enroll in a class equivalent to French 5 (FREN3001) & French 6 (FREN3002). You should **NOT** enroll in a course equivalent to French 4 (FREN2000) or of a lower level than French 4.

Important information on Credit-transfer application (2/3)

-Students may be considered for up to 6 units of courses for credit transfer;

depending on three criteria:

- (i) the number of contact hours (14 hours for one unit),
- (ii) language levels,
- (iii) performance in the course.

-We are not able to guarantee the results of credit-transfer application before you finish the course.

If you have any concern, please do not enrol the summer course to avoid false expectation.

- -Some students may not be able to transfer the credit as they repeat the same level at the French university as the courses they already completed at CUHK.
- -The credit transfer application is restricted to <u>language courses</u> only.

Important information on Credit-transfer application (3/3)

About your group level in France :

After your placement test (one the first day), make sure you are in an appropriate group:

- •Ask other CUHK student, if any, what level they have studied in CUHK;
- Compare the CUHK course outlines to the course outline in the school in France!

THE LÉGION D'HONNEUR CLUB HONG KONG CHAPTER

What is it?

The Summer French Language Scholarships are given out each year jointly by the Consulate General of France in Hong Kong and Macau and the Legion d'Honneur Club - Hong Kong Chapter. The objective of the scholarship is to encourage students studying French at higher educational institutes in Hong Kong and Macau to directly immerse themselves in French language and culture.

They are given to students who complete a 4-week intensive language course between June and September.

Who can apply?

Students who:

- are pursuing French courses at any university in Hong Kong or Macau;
- are at least 18 years old at the time of application;
- have at least a level of competence in French equivalent to a strong A1 level;
- have taken French courses for at least 2 semesters at their own institutions;
- are nominated by the French department of their own institution;
- have enrolled for an intensive French language summer course at a University Language Centre in France, accredited by the "Qualite FLE" label.

Guidelines

How to do?

- Complete the online registration for the study programme you chose through their website and process the necessary payment (tuition fees, accommodation fees, etc.) on your own.

- For inquiries, you should directly contact the host universities.

- Submit the online registration form through the following website from 1 to 31 March 2024:

- Your unofficial transcript downloadable from CUSIS will be required for the online registration.

Criteria

1) Number of French courses you took.

2) The cumulative GPA of these French courses.

3) Your overall cumulative GPA.

For the Recipients of the Scholarship

- You will be notified via email and be reimbursed after the completion of your study trips (In November, December or January).
- You are required to report to LIN Department if you receive any other CUHK funding support for your trips (not possible to cumulate some of them).

- Upon the completion of your summer session, you must submit copies of your certificate of attendance and/or academic reports together with the original copies of the payment receipts of the air tickets, tuition fees and accommodation fees for reimbursing the sponsorship.
- You also must submit a **written report** of 500-800 words in English on their overseas learning experience, together with **10 photos** taken during the study trip. LIN Department will have the right to publish and use them for promotion.



Students who have submitted the registration from together with their unofficial transcript will automatically be considered for the following financial supports administered by the Department of Linguistics and Modern Language

Moreover, the recipients are required to submit a written report of 500-800 words in English on their overseas learning experience, together with 10 digital photographs taken during the study trip.
